


How the camera menu works





Remember! Pegboards has to say click!





Let an adult iron the pattern. Iron with light pressure and in circular motions. The pattern is finished when you can **clearly see the colors**.

Remove carefully the paper.

Leave the pattern to cool under a book or other flat surface. Let it rest for a couple of minutes.

How to iron

How to iron Your pattern

Set the iron to **cotton (**).**

Put baking paper on top of the pattern.

Important! The teeth of the comb, must be between the spikes.

How the bead scraper works

This is how you get the beads off the pegboards

Gently press the scraper under the beads. and push forward in small jerks.
